



## **2017 The George Blood, L.P. Women in Audiovisual Archiving and Technology Scholarship**

The George Blood, L.P. Women in Audiovisual Archiving Scholarship is designed to facilitate the advanced education and training of women who wish to pursue careers in technical areas of audiovisual archives.

The scholarship is a result of the 2016 “Women in Tech” panel at the annual conference. George Blood asked panel organizers “How can we get past the talk – what can I DO?” This scholarship is a result of that discussion.

The \$4,000 scholarship is flexible in its structure, with a minimum of \$3,000 applied to tuition, but the option to apply \$1,000 towards travel to the annual conference. The scholarship is open to students who have an interest or experience in technical areas of the field, identify as women, and are enrolled in graduate-level or advanced programs (or accepted into such a program for the next academic year).

To be considered for a scholarship, an applicant must identify as female and meet the following eligibility requirements.

- The applicant must be enrolled full or part time in a graduate-level or other advanced program in moving image studies or moving image production, library or information management as regards moving image, archival moving image studies, museum moving image studies or a related scientific or technical moving image discipline (s); or must be accepted into such a program for the next academic year.
- The applicant must have an interest in or experience in technical areas of the profession.
- The applicant must have a grade point average of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his/her current or most recently completed academic program.

## The 2017 George Blood LP Women in Audiovisual Archiving and Technology Scholarship Application Instructions

---

The Scholarship recipient will receive a \$4,000 scholarship for the 2017-2018 academic year. Tuition funds will be sent to the student's educational institution and credited toward tuition and/or registration fees. The recipient will have the option of applying \$1,000 of the scholarship funds to travel for the AMIA Annual Conference in 2017. In addition, the recipient will receive complimentary registration to the 2017 AMIA Annual Conference.

To be considered for a scholarship, an applicant must identify as female and meet the following eligibility requirements.

1. The applicant must be enrolled full or part time in a graduate-level or other advanced program in moving image studies or moving image production, library or information management as regards moving image, archival moving image studies, museum moving image studies or a related scientific or technical moving image discipline (s); or must be accepted into such a program for the next academic year.
2. The applicant must have an interest in or experience in technical areas of the profession.
3. The applicant must have a grade point average of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his/her current or most recently completed academic program.
4. The applicant must submit the following documents:
  - a. A Scholarship application form (typed preferred). Resumes or curriculum vitae must be submitted to supplement the application form.
  - b. An essay of no more than 1,000 words describing the applicant's major field of study, interest in moving image archiving, relevant experience and/or education, and addressing the applicants interest in or experience in the technical areas of the field.
  - c. An official sealed transcript from the applicant's most recent academic program (including the institution's grading scale and/or GPA calculator) *sent directly from the academic institution* to the AMIA office.
  - d. Two letters of recommendation (*submitted separately to the AMIA office either by postal mail or via email*). Do not submit more than two.

Students who are also eligible for other AMIA Scholarships and/or the IPI internship must submit a complete application packet for consideration for each type of award; however, no applicant will receive more than one award. Students from any country may apply.
